We were pleased to secure sessions for our Year 7s with the AFL Schools program. Of the two planned sessions, one was a wash out, but the other was glorious sunshine and so much fun!



Start to Row Program

From an approach from Rowing Australia, and the initiative and passion of teacher, Jasmine Moya, Yarra Hills is now one of 10 schools Australia-wide engaged with the Coles Start2Row program. This involves:

- The gifting to us of a 'Concept 2' rowing ergometer (rowing machine)
- An indoor rowing program for 20 Years 9-10 students
- Two staff given free access to the Rowing Australian online indoor rowing coaching course. This will allow them to gain an accreditation and teach students how to use the rowing ergo.
- 10 entries to this year's Australian Indoor Rowing Championships, in October
- Associated learning resources

This is funded by Coles, with no cost to our school. We now have up-to-date rowing machines at both campuses, in their respective weights rooms.

In support of this, <u>Alexandra (Al) Viney</u>, a rowing para-athlete and para-olympian, visited the Mooroolbark campus on July 26 and addressed Years 7-10 students on both campuses (with at an assembly, or live-streamed). She gave an engaging and inspiring speech, telling us about her journey from being an able-bodied junior athlete to a para-athlete. Al also worked directly with the 20 Yarra Hills students involved in the program.



Romeo & Juliet

On Tuesday October 22, the Australian Shakespeare Company visited the Mooroolbark campus to perform an abridged version of Shakespeare's 'Romeo and Juliet' (the Term 4 English text) for our Year 10 students. Our Mt Evelyn Year 10 students were transported to and from their campus for this performance.

Koorie Excursion

We have a number of Koorie students who travel to the Yarra Ranges Tech School to take part in the indigenous collaborative strategy. Our students, as well as other students in the nearby network have been creating indigenous themed projects that will be presented in the 'Showcase Day' on September 13. These projects and past projects can be found onsite at Yarra Hills.

Rewards Points Excursion

A part of the School-Wide Positive Behaviour & Support program, students are awarded points when their actions consistently support our school values of Respect, Achievement, Endeavour and Pride. Each term, the students with the highest points are rewarded. This term, the Reward Points Excursion for 16 students was to GAMR Laser Tag in Chirnside Park.



Wear It Purple Day

Wear It Purple Day is an annual LGBTQIA+ awareness day, especially for young people. Participants wear purple (or pride-themed clothing) to celebrate diversity and young people from the LGBTQIA+ community. Students and staff engaged with the day, and it was well supported overall. There were minor instances of negativity from some students, highlighting the need for such events and for continued commitment to our Respectful Relationships program.



Senior Secondary School Reforms

A feature of the presentation at the Senior School Information evening was to inform families about the 'VCE Vocational Major'. While the day-to-day experience for students will not be notably different from the current VCAL program, there are a few significant changes:

- For Year 11, in 2023 VCAL will be called VCE Vocational Major
- All Year 11 students will participate in the VCE in 2023
- The VCE Vocational Major is a full 2-year course (currently, VCAL Intermediate is one year, and VCAL Senior is one year)
- Students can do VCE Vocational Major subjects and another VCE subject (if they are not undertaking a work placement/traineeship)
- Support for our SBAT (School-based apprenticeships and traineeships) students will move from the atEast group to the Headstart program

Note that YHSC will not be running the new Victorian Pathways Certificate program, as this has been deemed as unsuitable for our students' needs and aspirations.

Disney Dress-up Day

Year 12 is a special, and especially challenging year, and with the students, we look to regularly find ways to make it a little more fun. Year 12 had a Disney Dress-up day on Monday, August 22 and it was supported by many students and staff.



A Marathon Effort

Music students from both campuses recently participated in a 30-hour Music Marathon to raise funds for the Music Department. There were many band rehearsals during the two-day event and smaller ensembles also had some rehearsal time in preparation for the College Concert. Students played their musical instruments on a rotational basis for the full thirty hours - including during the long, overnight hours.







Each year we have more and more students who attempt to stay up for the entire 30 hours, and this year, there were at least 20 students who made it through the night without falling asleep – there were some very sleepy musicians however, during band rehearsals on the Friday. Congratulations to all students involved in this major fundraising event and thank you to all parents who gave up some of their normal "sleep time" to assist with the overnight supervision.

Shelter In Place (SIP)

The Mt Evelyn Campus, due to its high risk of fire danger, is listed on the Department of Education's Bushfire-At-Risk-Register (BARR). As such, it requires a designated Shelter-In-Place building. The gymnasium has been identified for this purpose, and the project of developing and modifying it to meet this need is underway. The replacement of the gym floor is expected to be available for school and community use at the start of Term 4. Skylights have also been installed as the final

component of the SIP upgrade.



As well as the gym maintenance, several other improvements have been

made at Mt Evelyn Campus. Shade sails have been now been installed, shading outdoor tables and benches, with an indigenous garden being developed in this area as a VCAL student project. An outdoor table tennis table has also been fully installed and is proving to be a most popular recess and lunchtime activity.

Wellbeing



Man Cave is a one-day program that supports male students to discuss the unique challenges and opportunities of masculinity. For a second time this year, the Man Cave program, with visiting external facilitators, ran for all Year 9 boys on the 23rd of August at the Mooroolbark campus.

Flourish also, on the same day as Man Cave, the organisation, 'Flourish', came to the Mooroolbark campus to run their level one program titled 'Flourish with Self' for all Year 9 girls.

This program is designed to give girls the opportunity to build the social and emotional tools they need to connect deeper with themselves. In the course, girls learn how to become more resilient and compassionate to themselves first, before they look to help and support others. The aims are that

girls:

- Address the relationship they have with self-judgement
- Experience and unpack how societal expectations impact themselves
- Learn to own the power of their own stories
- Realise that sharing vulnerably creates more connection
- Learn to build their self-awareness skills
- Create their own personalised tools and strategies to be more resilient moving forward
