

Principal's Report

Dear Parents, Carers, Students and Staff,

As the school year now comes to an end, I'd like to take a moment to reflect on some of the many events, experiences, initiatives and opportunities that have been provided for our students and staff throughout the year.

Our Camps Program is always a highlight for students, with Year Level Camps, Music Camp and Outdoor Education Camps taking place all around Victoria. Special thanks to Mr David Audesho our Camps Coordinator, Mr Richard O'Toole Director of Instrumental Music, and Mr Todd Derrick Outdoor Ed teacher, for their work in running these camps, as well as those staff who gave their time to join the students for these events.

Speaking of Instrumental Music, our wonderful program has continued throughout the year with our bands and ensembles practicing and performing at several college and community events. Our College Concert was an opportunity to showcase and highlight these performers, some of whom also participate in the Australian Youth Band. We are very lucky to have such a talented, and well-led, group.

The College Production was another highlight, with this year's 'Tribute to Broadway' providing a cavalcade of popular musical numbers from eleven legendary musicals including the likes of Grease & Hairspray. It was great to see the depth and breadth of our students' musical, dramatic and vocal performances. Well done!

Visual Arts was strongly represented, with our Yarra Hills Community Art Show providing displays and recognition of talent and effort, supported by local community and MPs.

Our extensive Sporting Program was again on show, with the college-wide Swimming and Athletics followed by Cross Country then District, Regional and Statewide team and individual performances. Thanks again to Mr David Audesho for his work with these students and teams.

Academically, we've had our High Achiever's Program running with those students identified as working above normal levels. Our STEAM program has continued with many students, in partnership with the Yarra Ranges Tech School, who have also supported some wonderful opportunities and programs for our indigenous students as part of our role in the Collaborative Indigenous Strategy. Our Support and Inclusion team have also worked tirelessly to build profiles and develop strategies to further support those students with additional needs.

We have worked with many of our local primary schools to provide extension in both Art and Literacy, as well as to experience our highly popular 'Flight School' activities. These activities help lay the foundations for a successful transition and entry into our secondary setting for many of these students.

While these above-mentioned activities are extensive, they are not exhaustive, there are countless other opportunities and experiences that have taken place during the year, each helping to build the foundations for our young adults to move into a successful future.

Year 12 Valedictory Dinner

Almost 300 people connected to our Yarra Hills community and Year 12 cohort gathered at Karralyka to celebrate the 2023 graduating class. It was an exceptional event, warmly engaged with by all, reflecting the impressive attention to detail from its organsiers, and the effort, care and preparation taken by all who were called to the stage for speeches and presentations.

Comedy Night


