Principal's Report

As we approach the end of 2024, it is a fitting time to reflect on the many achievements and experiences that have defined this year for our school community. Our students have had the privilege of participating in a diverse range of camps, both year-level and co-curricular. A particular highlight was the New Zealand Tour, where our instrumental music students not only performed but also represented Yarra Hills with distinction on an international stage.

The year also saw the resounding success of our Community Art Show and College Production, both of which celebrated the exceptional talents of our visual and performing artists. These events garnered widespread recognition and brought our school's creativity to the forefront of the



local community. Similarly, our students excelled in both individual and team sports, with many achieving outstanding results at regional and state levels.

Academically, we are proud of our continued improvement in NAPLAN growth results. These results reflect the significant 'value-added' contributions of our dedicated staff, who strive to support each student's learning journey, regardless of their starting point. This year's VCE outcomes also demonstrated promising progress, and we anticipate further success from our current cohorts in the years ahead.

Our commitment to academic excellence extended to our partnership with the Department of Education's High Achievers Program, which offered exceptional opportunities for students who qualified. Additionally, as key stakeholders in the Lilydale District and Yarra Valley Education Plan, we collaborated with local secondary schools to deliver initiatives such as the Collaborative Indigenous Strategy, enriching our students' understanding and engagement with important cultural themes.

The ongoing support from our community has been invaluable. Our School Council and Parents' and Friends' Association have played a vital role, providing feedback and contributing to key developments and fundraising efforts throughout the year. Their involvement underscores the strong partnership between our school and its wider community.

A standout event this year was the inaugural 'Car Show' held at the Mooroolbark Campus. This event was a tremendous success, showcasing not only the college but also the enthusiasm and talent within our community.

Farm School


Mooroolbark Farm School students had their last day in the course on December 6. The first activity of involved the maintenance of the chicken coup, involving spreading mulch and grass clippings.

Twilight Carols


