Cambridge Road access way

We've cooperated with our neighbours at St Johns' Rise Retirement Home to have the walking track to our Cambridge Road gate used as an access laneway for their construction works. The walkway has been separated into a path for students, and an access lane for construction-related vehicles (such as tip trucks), using large barriers topped with fencing. Vehicles will use the access lane intermittently from 7am-2.30pm for the next few months. When vehicles are using the lane, there will be traffic management staff supervising at both ends of the lane (from near our campus entrance, to the entry onto Cambridge Road). This arrangement shouldn't impact student access at all, nor student pick-up, but may cause some traffic congestion up until 8am
