We engage Morrisby testing to help our students understand their strengths and potential, and to guide them towards careers, subjects and future educational choices that could be a good fit. It involves students completing assessments, receiving a report and having an interview to go through it. It is useful particularly for conversations in Year 10 when students and families consider their senior pathway. At the conclusion of the interview stage, students and families receive a detailed report that includes: aptitudes, interests and attitudes, work style, organisational role, workplace, personality, learning style, the journey ahead, and career suggestions.
