### Attitudes to School Survey 2025

As you may be aware, each year all students across the state are surveyed to gain feedback about a number of significant aspects around their schooling, learning and wellbeing. The results that become available, which show percentage 'positive', 'neutral' and 'not positive' are then compared against the following categories:

- 'Similar Schools': these are the schools in the state that have the most similar demographic profiles, ie similar parent background, socio-economic status and cultural background. This can (and does) include schools from geographically distant areas, who are very similar in students/families. It may not include other local schools.
- 'Network Schools': these are the secondary schools in our local network. There are six in all, including YHSC: these are Lilydale HS, Lilydale Heights, Mooroolbark College, Healesville HS and Upper Yarra SC
- **'State'**: This is obviously the data for all secondary schools across the state and is usually the benchmark for high performance.








Day 3: Students took in breathtaking views from the Eureka Skydeck (well, what they could see

### **RSPCA - PAWS Excursion**

The RSPCA PAWS Program refers to RSPCA Victoria's educational program for secondary school students, Promoting Animal Welfare with Schools. It provides students in Years 7-10 with firsthand experiences at the RSPCA Burwood East facility to learn about animal welfare, meet rescued animals, and understand the RSPCA's mission to end animal cruelty. The program aims to promote ethical considerations for animals and inspire students to become advocates for animal welfare, with a curriculum-linked focus on empathy and social responsibility.

On August 15, 26 students from Years 9-12 travelled to the RSPCA for the program. They had a tour of the adoption centre, a visit to the education barn to meet rescued farm animals, and talked with RSPCA staff and volunteers to learn about their roles and career paths. The students learnt about the needs of different animal groups, compared animal welfare laws for farm and companion animals, and planned their own actions to help animals.



### **Product Design**

Our Year 9 Product Design Wood group has been hard at work this term with their first foray into the workshop. They started by learning about the design process we follow and how we manage safety in the workshop, before designing and building their own wooden phone stands. It's been fantastic to see students learning and using the different tools to bring their ideas to life. Up next is some practice joinery ahead of their major project next term designing and building their own storage and organisational system.





## Year 10 to Year 11 Transition Program

Each year in term 3 our Year 10 students undertake our Year 11 transition program. This includes:

- The Year 10 Transition Day, which includes presentations on the senior programs, a motivational speaker, a session on interview skills, and participating in a Q&A panel with older students and adults about educational and vocational choices.
- The Senior School information evening, which involved a keynote presentation on senior programs and their requirements, booths from external services and courses (such as the ADF, Headstart, Ringwood Training, Swinburne University), displays from the key learning areas of the VCE, and access to expert teachers and leaders to discuss senior programs

A Course Counselling Day, where students and families meet with a course counsellor to select their senior program and courses.

Year 10 students from Mt Evelyn came to the Mooroolbark for a fantastic, upbeat day of Year 10 students getting excited about their Year 11 (and beyond) educational and vocational journey.

## **OLLENS Careers Expo**

### Farm School

Each Semester we have ten students from Years 9 or 10 from each campus attend Woori Yallock Farm School one day per week. This semester, it is Mooroolbark students attending.

Woori Yallock Farm School is a non-traditional, outdoor education program offering hands-on learning in environmental management, personal development, and a variety of practical skills. Students engage in real-world projects such as ecosystem restoration, nursery work, and bushcraft, as part of a Certificate 1 in Conservation and Ecosystem Management. They are supported there by advisory teachers who personalise learning goals based on student and group interests.

At Farm School, students undertake environmental projects and participate in bushland restoration, indigenous plant nursery work, and wetland restoration. They engage in outdoor exploration: With the campus including bushland, bike and walking tracks, and outdoor workshop spaces, students do orienteering, bike maintenance, and fauna surveys. As well, students learn about local Indigenous culture, land history, and the significance of the site's historical buildings and surrounding landscape.
